Levels of Limited Licensing

Learning how to drive safely requires a lot of instruction, practice, and exposure. The Graduated Driver Licensing program was put in place to ensure that North Carolina teens build the experience needed to travel safely on our roads.

Level 1: Learner's Permit

1 Drive with a **Supervisor**



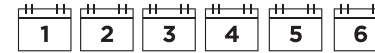
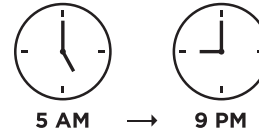
Who can supervise?

- Parent or Legal Guardian
- Grandparent
- Adult approved by Parent/Guardian

Supervisor must be:

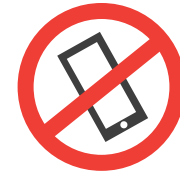
- Licensed 5 years or more
- Seated next to driver

2 Only drive from 5am-9pm

To Advance to Level 2:

1 Must Complete at least **60 hours** of supervised driving

At least 10 hours
driving at night

Supervisor must sign
for all hours in
DMV Driving Log

No more than
10 hours per week

2 Be at least 16 years old

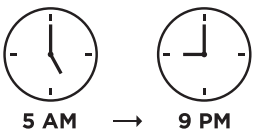
3 Have your Learner's Permit for one year

4 No moving violations or seat belt or phone infractions

5 Pass the road test

Level 2: Limited Provisional License

1 Drive unsupervised from 5am-9pm*



*Or when driving directly from work



2 No more than one passenger under 21 years old
