What is a Safety Action Plan?

- Data-driven approach
 - Responsive to crash history
 - Proactive by looking at risk
- ☐ Informed and co-led by the community
- ☐ Set of recommended strategies and countermeasures
 - Near, mid- and long-range projects and programs
 - Engineering and non-engineering strategies
- Documentation analysis results, safety needs, and priorities
- Approach for ongoing community support for traffic safety

Example Safety Plan Strategies



ENGINEERING

Infrastructure countermeasures like lighting improvements, signal timing, pavement markings



EDUCATION

Safety outreach like PSAs, interactive maps, giveaways/ promotions



ENFORCEMENT

Imposing stricter penalties for speeding, using crash data analysis to identify priority area



EMERGENCY SERVICES

Coordinated medical data, response times

Goals for Safety Plan

- ☐ Achieve significant reduction in fatalities and serious injuries on the region's transportation system.
- ☐ Inform other countywide efforts such as the Vision Zero Task Force and Comprehensive Transportation Plan (CTP).
- ☐ Increase awareness of transportation safety and risks.
- ☐ Identify needs and recommended safety improvements.
- Ensure consistency with Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP) and USDOT safety planning requirements.
- ☐ Create inputs for future grant applications for priority projects.



Safety Plan Objectives

- ☐ Inventory and analysis of existing conditions and historical safety trends.
- Assessment of traffic-safety related policies and programs.
- Robust and diverse public engagement allowing for both community representation and feedback.
- ☐ Coordination with NCDOT, VZ Task Force, local governments, county officials and Lumber River RPO.
- Prioritization of safety strategies and project types.

A campaign since 2018 to eliminate traffic deaths




Bladenboro mock crash event




SAFE SAFER ACCESS FOR EVERYONE LUMBERTON, NC

C – Systemic Improvements


D – Roundabout

Intersection Improvement




- Roundabouts

Lumber River RPO (Vulnerable Road User Safety)

- 64% of KA bike and ped crashes occurred in rural areas (on 2 lane undivided roads with posted speed of 55 mph)
- 74% KA bike ped crashes occur in dark
- 85% of KA bike and crashes occurred outside of an intersection
